



RIPE 69 | London - UK | 7 November 2014

- Top decision-making organ of the ITU
- Held every four years
 - Three weeks duration
 - 20 October - 7 November in Busan, South Korea
- Sector Members can attend, but [generally] only Member States can speak
 - RIPE NCC present as Sector Member
 - RIPE community members joined various Member State delegations

- PP operates by reaching agreement between Member States on Resolutions (180+), Decisions
- Certain Resolutions relate specifically to Internet issues:

101 Internet Protocol-based networks

102 ITU's role with regard to international public policy issues pertaining to the Internet and the management of Internet resources, including domain names and addresses

180 Facilitating the transition from IPv4 to IPv6
