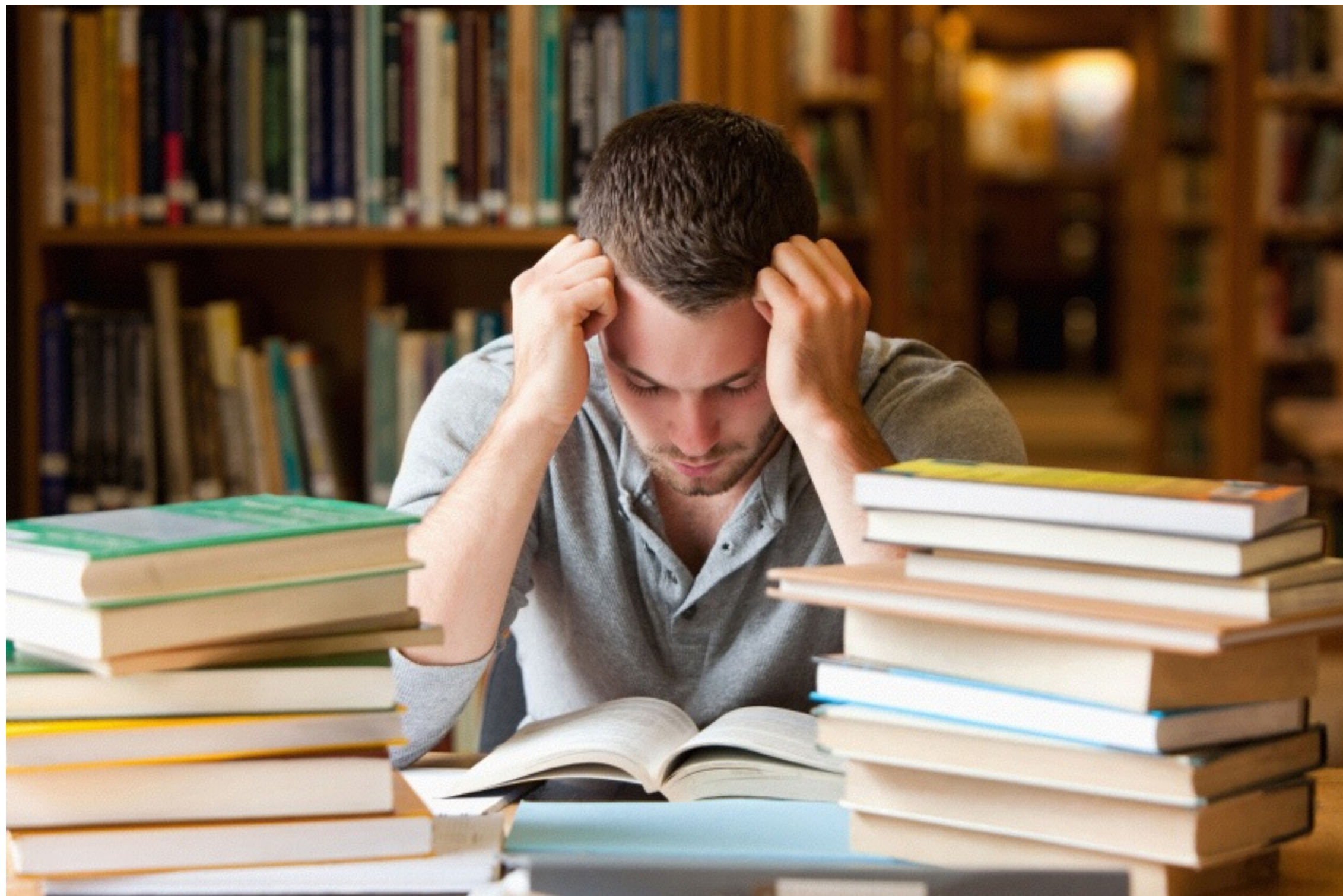

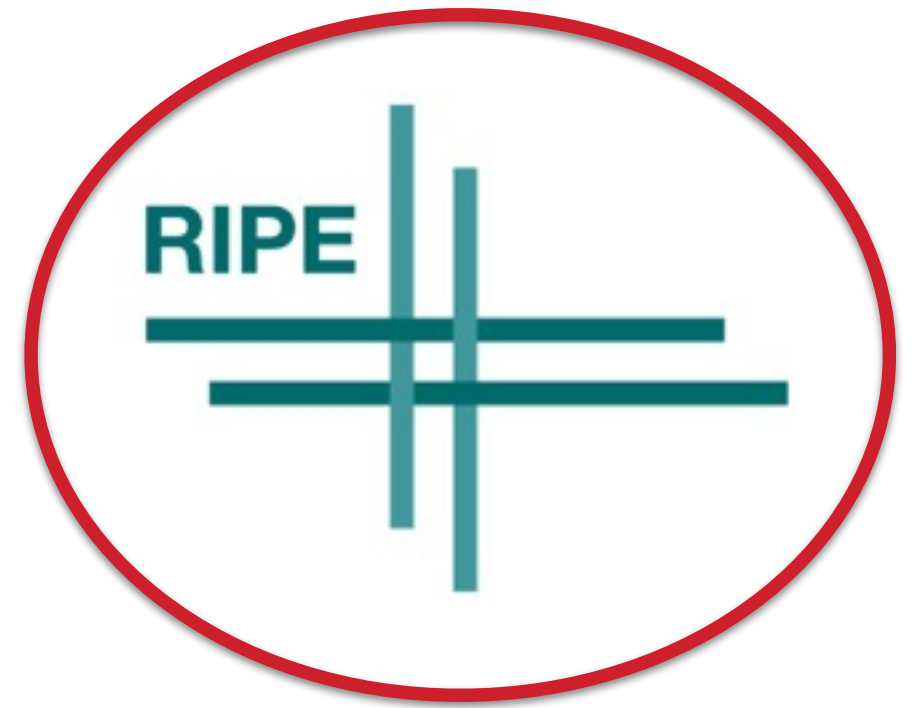


Formed in 1989

Open for everyone

RIPE Working Groups





Formed in 1992

Incorporated organisation based in Amsterdam (and Dubai)

Secretariat for the RIPE community

RIR for Europe, the Middle East and Parts of Central Asia

11,000+ members and growing

Not-for-profit



Not “just” an RIR

Formed by the RIPE community to act as secretariat and carry out activities on its behalf

To enable the community to gather online and in person

Got the “blessing” from the community to become an RIR
shortly afterwards

You can **rate plenary presentations**.

Highly-rated speakers will have a higher chance of being on
the programme again (and vice-versa).

You **must have a RIPE NCC Access account** - making one is
simple!

Have a Great Idea for a Plenary Presentation?

You can **submit a presentation for the RIPE Meeting Plenary.**

It will be reviewed by the RIPE Programme Committee (PC).

Keep an eye out for the **Call for Presentations** - usually opens **six months before the meeting.**

RIPE Programme Committee

Elected by RIPE Meeting attendees

Review submissions for plenary content and select speakers/presentations

Aim to provide a **dynamic plenary** that delivers what attendees want to see

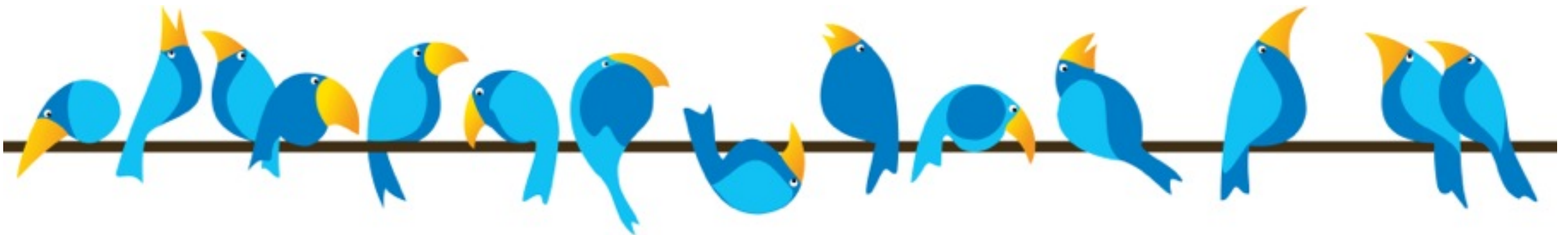
“Birds of a Feather” - **people with the same interests gathering** to talk about a particular topic/issue

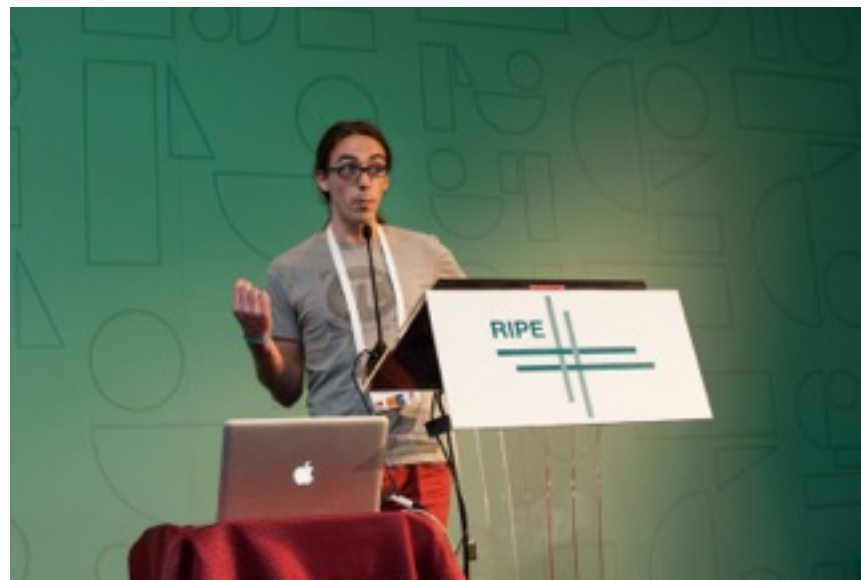

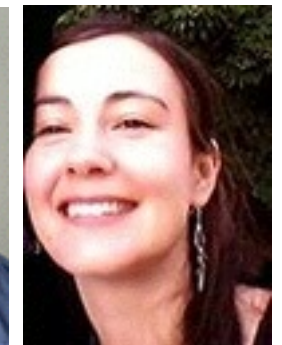
